Independent Day School - Corbett Campus Offers A Wide Variety of Summer Camp Programs

Independent Day School - Corbett Campus (IDS-CC) in Tampa will be offering a wide variety of summer camp experiences focused on recreation, fine arts, sports, adventure, and field trips as well as an academic enrichment program for children in grades Pre-Kindergarten through eighth during the months of June and July.

With 30 different mini camps, and 90 full and half-day sessions, *Camp IDS 2004* provides a summer camp experience that meets the broadest spectrum of interests and ages in the area. Special adventure and sports programs focused specifically on the interests of middle school age children are also offered, and there are several academic enrichment programs for all ages.

Camp IDS 2004

Camp IDS 2004 sports and recreation mini camps are one week in length and are offered during five sessions from June 21 through July 23, 8:30 A.M. - 3:00 P.M. Extended care is available in the mornings from 7:30 – 8:30 A.M. and in the afternoons from 3:00 – 6:00 P.M. There is an additional fee for the extended day care.

“Camp IDS is unique because children can choose what they want to do,” said Barbara Grady, camp director. “We offer so many different mini camps parents can tailor their selections to create a unique experience to meet their child’s specific interests. For example, a child can participate in band, cooking, or broadcasting in the morning, and then drama, computers, photography, or model rocketry in the afternoon.”

New this summer will be Web page design, piano, musical theater, and multi-player computer games. In addition, *Camp IDS 2004* offers nine different sports options: archery, basketball, cheerleading, flag football, karate, lacrosse, soccer, sports games, and volleyball.

Full day recreation camps for children ages 3 through 7 are designed for individual age groups. Preschoolers enjoy games, crafts and activities on campus, while older children visit local attractions and parks to bowl, skate, play putt-putt, and see movies.

An “Adventure Camp” is offered for children in grades 3 through 5 enabling them to visit MOSI, the Florida Aquarium, the Lowry Park Zoo, and Weeki Wachee, and to enjoy canoeing, gardening, ice skating, and swimming. Campers in grades 6 through 8 can participate in “Teen Rec,” which includes a variety of activities such as rock climbing, laser tag, ice skating, horseback riding and more.

Wilderness Extreme

5th thru 8th graders can participate in a “Wilderness Extreme” camp featuring hiking, orienteering, mountain biking, snorkeling, canoeing, teambuilding, roller blading, and rock climbing. Wilderness Extreme is offered twice, June 14-18 and July 26-30, from 8:30 A.M.-5:30 P.M.

Middle School Athletics

One-week sports camps designed solely for middle school students in grades 6-8 who plan to participate on a school team during the upcoming year will be offered in girls and boys basketball, cheerleading, volleyball and soccer. Specific session dates vary and are available by calling the school.

Academic Enrichment – Grades 2-8

Children in grades 2-8 will have the opportunity to enhance their skills and increase their knowledge in reading, math or Spanish during one-week enrichment camps. Sessions will be offered from 8:30 - 11:30 A.M., June 14-18 and July 26-30.
