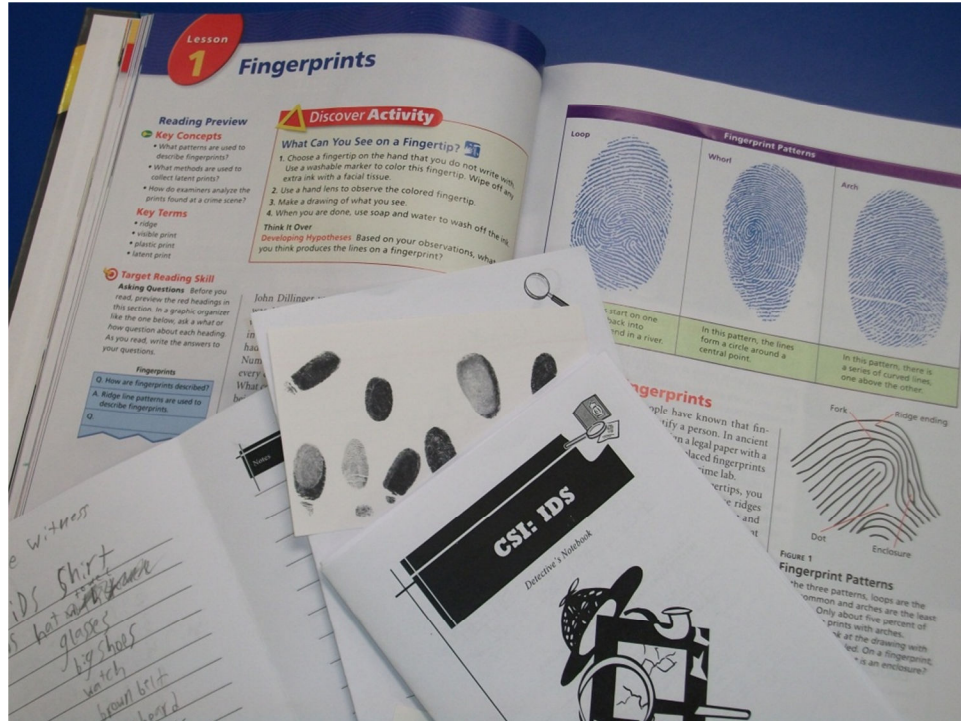


IDS Camp CSI: IDS

June 24, 2011 (TAMPA, Fla.)—For two consecutive weeks this summer, CAMP IDS at Independent Day School-Corbett Campus is hosting a summer camp for budding crime scene investigators. During each week-long, half-day camp, IDS middle school science teacher Heather Robinson will provide plenty of hands-on opportunities for campers to refine their observation and inference skills as they perform multiple forensic science experiments.

Campers will use microscopes to examine trace evidence such as hair and fingerprints, extract and analyze DNA, and experiment with chromatography. The camp culminates each week with a visit from a real Tampa Police Department crime scene investigator who will walk the campers through a crime scene analysis.

The camp takes place June 20-24 from 8:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. and June 27-July 1 from 12 p.m. - 3 p.m. Campers are in grades five through eight.
