Description: The Internet, as it is today, has made many of our lives easier. We can access just about anything from our computers and/or cell phones. The World Wide Web, Facebook, Twitter, MySpace, Skype...are all common buzz words in our everyday life. Communication with friends and family are all easier because of advances in the internet.

While the Internet can be advantageous, we must also remember that it has created new vulnerabilities for the safety and privacy of those who use the Internet. We have chosen to **be proactive** for both our parents and our children.

2. The FBI Special Agent will address middle school students on September 21, 2011, on Internet Safety.

WHAT'S UP...

THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM AT IDS: Many people ask us about the IB program. Yes, we have been authorized for IB for several years. Our Pre-K3 through 8th grade students are all treated to a lesson planning format that translates the IB's Program of Inquiry process into dynamic and captivating lessons throughout our subject areas. For example, Upper Primary just kicked off a unit on healthy life styles where reading, math, science and even social science are brilliantly woven into lessons that emphasize exploration, reflection and good judgment. For example:



Bon Appétit, from Upper Primary! Last Friday all of the Upper Primary students "walked the talk" of the International Baccalaureate Learner Profile demonstrating how to be a risk-taking and an open-minded learner. To kickoff their first unit of inquiry, "**Bon Appétit**" (Who We Are), the students were all gathered in the Farish Center where an array of foods were ready to be tasted and tested. Titled the "**Fun Food Factor Challenge**", each student was able to travel to all five centers, sample a food from each area, and decide which food group it represented. The teachers selected foods from each food group that may have been new and "outside of the box" for many students. For example, on the fruit table, one could select mango, avocado or kiwi or on the dairy table one could choose from feta cheese, vanilla Greek yogurt or cottage cheese. The goal was two-fold: to have the students begin to experience and identify food groups and to expand their knowledge of the types of foods that fit into each category. As this unit of inquiry continues, our Upper Primary students will learn the **central idea** about how "**The foods people eat affect their health.**" Our students were excited to experience this challenge and went home with pride in having participated in the "Fun Food Factor Challenge!"



HIGHLIGHTS FROM MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 12, 2011...

Monday was a lovely day of remembrance that was filled with opportunities to demonstrate gratitude and kindness. Each division had its own twist on contributing to the dignity and respect that permeated the campus on that day. Some of the examples included:

MIDDLE SCHOOL: The entire IDS-CC community continued the annual tradition of sixty seconds of silence to honor the memory of those who perished on 9/11/2001 and the heroes who worked valiantly to save lives 10 years ago. Middle school students filed respectfully out of their building and circled the flag pole and then waited for the school-wide announcement of the moment of silence. Eighth grader Lumiere Rostick played *Taps* for the entire school over the loud speaker system. When she returned to join her classmates, she was greeted with a spontaneous appreciative applause from the entire middle school!

Next the middle schoolers gathered on the field for a special task. Dressed in red, white and/or blue, the student body formed the letters USA and then remained in formation while Mrs. Jagdmann snapped their photo. They plan to use this photo to create notecards to send appreciation and gratitude to our troops, veterans, and firefighters throughout the coming year. INTERMEDIATE DIVISION from Mrs. Hill: *Since this year's September 11th event was to honor those who give service to the community, we thought we would then in turn give service to the IDS community. Our task was to have our students come up with ways we could help our immediate IDS community and others.*

FIFTH GRADE: Fifth graders decided to focus on giving to the IDS community to allow our Facilities Team, who cleans our rooms after school, to be able to go home 15 - 20 minutes earlier on September 12. The Fifth graders all pulled together to clean the room entirely. They worked diligently emptying trash cans and recycle bins, cleaning the windows inside and out, using the vacuum, dusting the shelves, sweeping outside, scrubbing the ledges outside, etc. These acts of kindness demonstrated to them that you can make someone's day special just by giving of yourself. They also gained an appreciation for how much others do for us.

FOURTH GRADE, GOING PLACES saw pictures of the new September 11th Memorial. Then teams brainstormed words of gratitude for our United States military in appreciation for how they protect our nation and places around the world. The list of words that demonstrated gratitude will be delivered to soldiers at the local Veteran's Administration Hospital.

MULTI-AGE 3/4, ALL STARS brainstormed ideas for how to give service which led them to volunteering in Kindergarten. They divided up between the three Kindergartens and read stories to them during their rest time. This was a win-win as the intermediate students were able to practice their oral reading skills and the Kindergarteners were able to practice their listening skills and enjoy having a book read to them. Additionally, the All Stars decided to be more deliberate in their cleaning of their lunch area at the pavilion. Their hard work was greatly appreciated by the facilities staff member on duty. The kids felt so good about making him happy that they did it again the next day also. They were determined to continue to have that community spirit and giving mentality. They realized a little work on their end went a long way to show thanks for service that is given to them daily.

GRADE 3, THE NAVIGATORS decided to give service to the IDS community. Specifically, they wanted to help out in the library where they helped straighten books and assisted the younger Mighty Monkeys as they checked out books. Once books were checked out, the Navigators also read with their Mighty Monkey buddies. This allowed them to also practice their oral reading skills and the Mighty Monkeys were able to practice their listening skills and enjoy having a book read to them.

FLOWER PATCH - PRE-K3, BEACH BUDDIES - PRE-K4, AND KINDERGARTEN - FROGS worked in their classrooms to create beautiful murals that depicted patriotism and acts of kindness. They shared meaningful discussions on kindness and appreciation for one another and on how to build a culture of caring and community. The Beach Buddies also were proud that they used their helping hands to make their playground "trash-free" for all to enjoy.

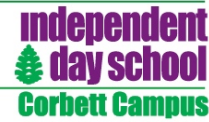

Learning About Happiness, Gratitude Inspires IDS-CC Students

During the annual middle school retreat at Independent Day School-Corbett Campus, students reflected on how to achieve success by applying scientific research on happiness to their own lives and learning.

Sept. 15, 2011 (TAMPA, Fla.) – It was the perfect way to begin a retreat for middle schoolers – with a YouTube video. Within seconds, an 8-month-old baby laughing hysterically over ripping paper had 181 sixth, seventh, and eighth graders smiling and laughing.

On that morning, the video – which had been available online for less than 7 months – had already been viewed more than 26 million times.

"Clearly, the popularity of this video indicates that laughter is contagious," said Independent Day School-Corbett Campus Headmaster Dr. Joyce Burick Swarzman. "Laughter spreads joy; and now scientific research proves that when we're happy, we're more successful."



Throughout the retreat, students reflected on the impact of happiness and a positive attitude on success.

And that premise, Dr. Swarzman reminded students, was the fundamental principle on which Independent Day School-Corbett Campus was founded.

"In 1968, two wise women started IDS on the ideal that happy children who are respected as unique individuals will be excited about school and eager to learn," said Dr. Swarzman. "We focus on developing a positive approach to life and learning because we have always believed that being positive and joyful is key to success. And now research supports that philosophy."

That scientific research on happiness, conducted by

internationally renowned positive psychology expert Shawn Achor and explained in his motivational management video, "The Happiness Advantage," was the theme for the 2011 Middle School Retreat. The retreat is a yearly middle school tradition that takes place over two mornings inside the school's Farish Center and is led by Dr. Swarzman, a training expert.

"Dr. Swarzman conducts these retreats exactly the way she does training for adults," said Middle School Division Leader Betty George. "Doing so sets a high level of expectation for the students. Treating them with dignity and respect also means we will receive it in return."

Students were organized into small groups at long tables, intermingling all grade levels. The goal was to give everyone an opportunity to learn together with classmates in other grades and encourage community building.

The retreat format integrated guided viewing of Achor's video with time for individual reflection and journaling that was interspersed with small-team discussion facilitated by teachers.

This year's focus on Achor's research about the science of happiness showed students that the brain when primed to be positive and happy, outperforms the brain that is primed to be negative or even neutral.

"And that correlates so well to what we have always strived to do at IDS, which is to create a positive environment for kids," said Mrs. George. "Shawn Achor's research shows that being happy and positive fuels success."

It was a message that clearly resonated with IDS-CC middle schoolers.

Eighth grader Daniela Torres, for example, was eager to share the advantages of being a happy person with her family.



Students showed gratitude for classmates entering the Farish Center for the retreat. Middle schoolers also practiced gratitude by doing the popular "Gratitude Dance."

"Although I am usually positive, Shawn Achor's video triggered a certain consciousness and ever since then I have been watching my attitude and trying to truly make the best of everything," said Daniela. "I also began to ask myself, 'How can I make sure that I can spread the happiness to those who surround me?'"

"A grateful person is a happy person. And a person who has a positive outlook on life and is happy is more successful," said classmate Sam Goetz.

Eighth-grade student Jonah Kornberg said having the opportunity to watch the video and reflect on its message taught him about how the brain works, in addition to the ways that he can make himself a better, more well-rounded person. "This video taught me that life is limitless," said Jonah. "And it inspired me to be better in every way possible."

"It made me think of all the things I am grateful for and to show gratitude," said seventh grader Acacia Madrone.

"Growing up at IDS and being raised and taught to be positive, it comes as second nature now," said Lumiere Rostick, an eighth grader. "But Shawn Achor has shown me the importance of being positive and how it can and will help me be more successful in the future."

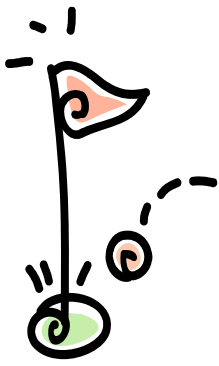
