For the next eight weeks, students in grades 2 - 8 are invited to participate in the classroom practice sessions, part of the Independent Day School Spelling Bee Competition. *On the East Side, there was an introduction by last year's upper primary bee winners and a video of highlights from last year's spelling bee, showing students engaged in the excitement of spelling words. "Akeelah" reminded students to get to the start line, improve continuously, be prepared, stay relaxed, and dive into the word lists with confidence and fun.

*In the Middle School, each grade met to build excitement about the benefits that come from learning to spell and understand word roots correctly. Each grade had a mock spelling bee to build the momentum and enthusiasm for participation. The hard work does pay off in many ways.

THIRD and FOURTH GRADES GEAR-UP FOR THEIR FIELD TRIP by Mrs. Cashen:

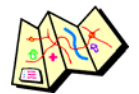
In preparation for their upcoming field trip to Mahaffey Theatre to see the performance *Sadako and the Thousand Cranes*, Third and Fourth graders will be making origami cranes. The All Stars began this on Wednesday. The reader might be asking, "Why Cranes?"



The students are learning that these cranes represent peace and are directly connected to the Japanese belief that if one is to make one thousand paper cranes their wish will come true. Using their morning journals, the All-Star students reflected on the International Baccalaureate attitudes and decided which attitudes they could work on in their own personal life. They wrote the name of this attitude on the back of their origami paper before creating their paper crane. After much folding, the room came alive with beautiful and colorful paper cranes. When students were sharing their examples with each other, one student proclaimed that, "This is amazing! We are helping to make world peace." The teachers plan to hang the paper cranes in the classroom as a reminder of this commitment to peace and positive attitudes and action from right here to around the world.

7TH GRADE SOCIAL STUDIES FROM MR. SHOE: SO, HOW ARE YOUR MAP SKILLS?

Important standards and benchmarks in learning about World History and Geography is understanding how to read and interpret maps...not just any map, but six types that include Political, Physical, Climate Zones, Vegetation Zones, Population Density and Economic Activity. To delve into this information, students are using Kagan Cooperative Learning Structures, center/stations for each of the six types of maps, and a system for interaction that will be applied to all countries throughout the world by starting close to home with the United States and Canada. These mapping lab activities mirror a scavenger hunt for finding information about our world. Knowledgeable citizens aware of the world and our similarities and differences are definitely 21st Century Skills.

Please know that these items are provided for your information and convenience. If you wish to make a commitment prior to the September kick off, we would be delighted to accept it. The ABC's of Annual Giving

What is Annual Giving?

Tuition at IDS-CC, like most independent schools, only covers a portion of the operating cost of the school each year. Annual Giving is key to bridging the gap to ensure a level of excellence for every student and family while maintaining a tuition level that is affordable. This year, tuition is expected to cover approximately 75% of the school's operating costs.

Why not simply raise tuition?

We constantly strive to keep our tuition as reasonable as possible. Annual Giving allows every family and individual to give at the level at which they are financially able. Every contribution, no matter the amount, is very much appreciated. Because it is a donation, it is tax-deductable and may also qualify for corporations' matching gifts, which multiply the value of a single gift.

How is Annual Giving different from other contributions to IDS-CC?

Annual Giving funds go directly toward the operating budget of the school, helping pay for items ranging from faculty salaries and professional development to facility maintenance. Other fundraising is generally more specific, such as one-time fundraisers benefiting class projects or a capital campaign to add new facilities. Events coordinated through the **Parent Faculty Association** raise funds for specific items, such as technology. A second important goal of the **PFA** is to encourage a sense of community and fellowship among our families by working together.

What is the campaign goal for 2011-12?

Our financial goal is **\$200,000**, and our **participation goal is always 100%**. In addition to indicating support for the school, the level of participation is important when **IDS-CC** applies for grants. Annual Giving participation is one method of measuring the strength of a not for profit organization for outside funders such as foundations or community grants.

What is Fair Share?

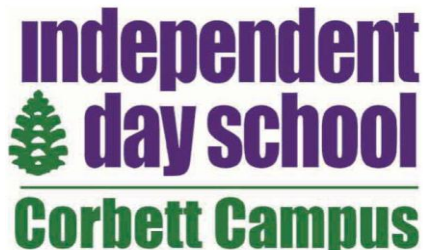
Each year the Board of Trustees determines a Fair Share amount for families to contribute to the Annual Giving Campaign. Many families request some guide for contributions and in response, the Board provides a Fair Share recommendation. The Fair Share is based upon the financial goal of the campaign and the student population. The Fair Share is a per student suggested donation. This year Fair Share is \$450.00 per student. While we provide this Fair Share suggested contribution, all gifts are deeply appreciated and families are asked to contribute what they are able or as much as possible.

How can I make my donation?

We have many options available. You may pay with cash, pay with a check, pay with a credit card, or use PayPal online at our website. You may pay your entire donation at one time, or you may pay your pledge later in the year. We are also happy to accept installments throughout the year.
