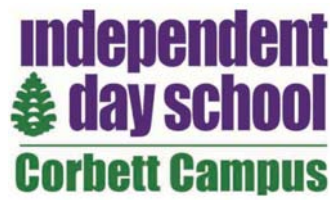

## CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS: SO MUCH TO SHARE...JUST THE ICING ON THE CAKE!

**HEADMASTER OF THE DAY: DR. GREGORY COX, (Third Grade Multi-age All Star)** captured the spirit of the season by leading the Monday morning meeting on December 12, 2011, with confidence and ease. On the agenda for Headmaster Dr. Cox was the Science Fair exhibit/competition in the Grand Room, the cheerleading competition on December 17 for "Cheer for a Cure," the Intermediate Division's amazing Leadership Council and all of their accomplishments, the Sally Foster Gift Wrap winners, the Ninth Annual Sports Challenge on January 6, 2012, and December Birthdays. And of course, he declared all of his plans for the day...including his WIDS cameo performance playing the violin and the piano as a great tribute to our Community School of the Arts. It was a day of smiles, hard work and great leadership in the making. Thanks to Dr. Carol Cox and Dr. John Cox for winning this opportunity in the live auction at last year's big event.

### **THEY DID IT AGAIN FOR THE THIRD YEAR IN A ROW: IDS-CC MIDDLE SCHOOL--JR.**

**THESPIAN TROUPE 88622:** For the third year in a row, the members of the Independent Day School's Jr. Thespian Troupe 88622 stepped up to the challenge in Performing Arts Competition. Troupe 88622 is made up of twenty-nine IDSers who are involved in Musical Theatre, Drama, and the One Act. Since the beginning of the school year, middle school students have been working on their craft to prepare to compete in six different performance categories: Duet Acting, Monologue, Solo Musical, Duet Musical, Small Group Musical, and One Act Play. The competition took place on Saturday, December 10<sup>th</sup> in Tampa, with approximately 700 students participating from as far away as Sarasota and Lakeland. Throughout the day, all members, coaches and parents of Troupe 88622 traveled to see and support each act. Every student excelled, and each one felt the warmth and appreciation of the entire troupe for his/her performances.

The Independent Day School One Act play, This Is a Test, earned the Best in the District Critics' Choice Award. For three years in a row, IDS has been awarded this honor. Our own eighth grader, Victoria Beaudoin, earned the Best in the District Critics' Choice Award for her Solo Musical performance of "Possibilities" from Superman the Musical. (She also sang the song at this week's Monday Morning Meeting and earned a spontaneous standing ovation from her peers.) The Small Group Musical piece "But I Do" from the musical, I Love You Because, earned second place for the entire competition in that category for Victoria Beaudoin, Julia Peacock, Jonah Kornberg, and Alex Rivera. **For Troupe 88622, twelve different pieces (including the One Act) earned a Superior, and five earned Excellent. This is an amazing accomplishment! Congratulations to all students who participated! Bravo, Thespians!**

**FROM THE KINDERGARTEN "FUN" TASTIC FROGS:** The bags were packed, passports were in hand, and the "fun"tastic frogs travelled around the world! During our current unit of study, "Traditions", the students have been inquiring about how celebrations and traditions help unify people. As they travelled to each country, they experienced the holidays and traditions celebrated during this time of year. Through hands-on centers, books, games, music and role play, they were immersed in the culture and traditions of each holiday.

For example, they boarded the Kindergarten Express and traveled to **Holland** for the celebration of St. Nicholas Day (or Sinterklass) to see the arrival by boat of Sinterkass with his little helpers, the Zwarte Piets. On horseback, he rides through the towns bringing gifts to all of the children. Instead of stockings, children leave their wooden shoes out to be filled with goodies. Kindergarteners made their own "wooden" shoes, hoping maybe they too would get a treat. Another stop on their journey was to the **Ukraine**, where they learned that Mykolai leaves gifts under pillows and families fling pudding up to their ceilings, hoping it will stick so they may have a year of good fortune.

They traveled to **Israel** for Hannukah, receiving special gifts (stickers, dreidels, etc.) and students explored Hannukah centers where they saw the lighting of the menorah, played the dreidel game, sampled latkes and more! Off to **England**, they learned the meaning of the Christmas cracker and the tradition of finding a gold coin in the Christmas pudding. Legend has it that when the children write their letters to Father Christmas, they throw them in the fireplace and the smoke carries their wishes right up to the man in the red suit. They continued their international travels to **Puerto Rico, Africa, Sweden, and India**.

They sent the Gingerbread Man around the world and in return, they received many postcards back filled with wonderful traditions and ideas. Their passports are filled with a new understanding for how people are the same and different. Traditions and celebrations add to the joy we all experience.

**DID YOU HEAR ABOUT TOOLS OF THE TRADE?...A Big Hit with The IDS Upper Primary Brilliant Bugs, Cool Cats and Mighty Monkeys:**

Where do you hear students contemplating the function of an architectural structure? Right in the IDS Upper Primary classrooms where an inquiry into the International Baccalaureate unit of “How the World Works” took place in their inquiry unit called Tools of the Trade. The unit name for this beginning study of architecture had a central idea to delve deep into the concepts that “*Function can determine the design and construction of an architectural structure.*” The result had young inquiring minds expanding their knowledge of construction which they enjoyed in their younger years with blocks, Legos and Lincoln Logs. They took those principles to a deeper understanding like:

- Form follows function is a design approach whereby the form of the building is determined by the function of the interior space.
- Nature is a model for architectural forms and shapes (natural/manmade structures).
- A structure’s function can be a frame design (made to hold weight) or shell design (made to house things or people).
- Structures of the past and present display the use of columns and beams, triangles, domes and arches throughout the world.

Their incredibly amazing trip to Florida’s Legoland helped to culminate this unit. Our students, with the help of many IDS parents, set out on a mission to explore all the structures of Legoland. They spied frame and shell structures, viewed those structures with a perspective assignment named “*One Small Square*” and tested their architectural knowledge to build and test structures in the Imagination area of Legoland. As a special treat, Andrea Johannpeter (Inacio’s mom in the Cool Cats) and Hank Custin (Gracyn’s dad in the Brilliant Bugs) shared all of their architectural knowledge with us. Both presentations had our students riveted and excited to learn more about the intricacies of becoming an architect!

**MIDDLE SCHOOL ENGINEERING ELECTIVE:** It seems that to compete in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, the U.S. is going to need creative and innovative engineers. The engineering elective, with Science Teachers Mrs. Cardona and Mr. De Guzman is preparing our students for the future. Soon you will read more about how they are competing in a junkyard challenge where they use boxes of materials to build specific engineering structures. The word is...very cool...

**IDS MATH TEACHER VENTURES OUT AS AN IB TRAINER.** The weekend of December 2-5 was a new step for Tom Bronson, as he moved from being an IB teacher to being an International Baccalaureate workshop leader. Being one of only 30 educators chosen to go through the IBEN (IB Educator Network) training in June, he completed his first assignment in Baltimore, Maryland for math educators.

The IB Programme divides its workshops into three categories: Category I (Beginner), Category II (Advanced), and Category III (Specialized). Mr. Bronson was in charge of the Category II – Mathematics workshop where he helped 25 educators from around the US and Canada take the next steps towards instruction through inquiry, authentic assessment, the IB Areas of Interaction, and the IB Learner Profile. He also returned to IDS-CC with a wealth of new information about the upcoming changes in the IB Programme, some new ideas for the math department, and a HUGE feeling of relief to have found success at his first outing as a IB workshop leader.

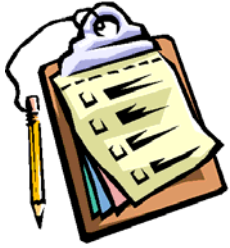
